KEYWORKER SERVICES

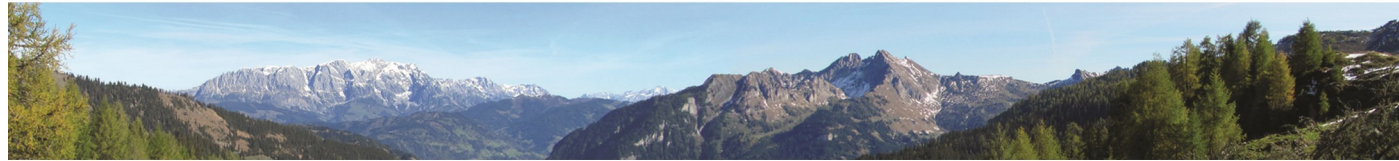


Sources' Keyworker program provides individual and community based services in Fort Saint John and Fort Nelson. The Keyworker program will provide a specialized Keyworker to work directly with families. Depending on the needs of the family, the Keyworker may work with the family directly in their home/community. The Keyworker provides information, referrals, in-home support and evidence based Positive Behaviour Support to families with children with FASD/CDBC. The Keyworker will help caregivers:

- access resources
- learn skills
- develop an ongoing network of support
- use Positive Behaviour Support to address
- challenging behaviour

Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) and Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) are the only approaches that are evidence based and have been shown to result in significant changes in challenging behaviour.

The primary objective of the Keyworker program is to support families through the diagnosis process as well as after diagnosis, and to enhance community awareness and prevention of CDBC/FASD. Community services include presentations, community aware activities and support groups.



Step 1 : Do You Qualify?

In order to qualify for services through the Keyworker program, the child or adolescent must meet all of the following criteria:

- Children/Youth (ages 0-18)

AND

- Have a diagnosis of a Complex Developmental Behavioural Condition such as (but not limited to) the following:
 - Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)
 - Attention Deficit (ADD) or Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)

OR

- Be suspected of having a Complex Developmental Behavioural condition and be seeking a diagnosis.



Step 2 : How Do I Refer?

Sources' Keyworker program accepts referrals from families, MCFD, doctors, schools and other community based agencies. In order to ensure proper referral to the Keyworker program the following steps should be completed:

- Complete the Sources' referral form.
- Include any diagnostic reports or other relevant assessments, reports or documents.

Step 3 : Contact with Sources Community Resources Society

The Keyworker will contact the referred family upon approval/waitlist status.

If the family is accepted into Sources' Keyworker program, they will be sent a confirmation letter and information package outlining services.

The family will be contacted upon removal of waitlist to conduct an intake. The Keyworker will share detailed information about the Program and gather information about the family.
