


White Rock Baptist Church's 46th Christmas Dinner



TOTEM PARK IN WHITE ROCK – A LIVING SPACE FOR TRUTH & RECONCILIATION LEARNING

Located along the waterfront at East Beach, Totem Park is more than a scenic stop – it is a quiet but meaningful place for Truth and Reconciliation learning within White Rock.

The park features carved totem poles that reflect Indigenous cultural traditions, teachings, and storytelling. Set against the ocean, the artwork invites visitors to pause and consider the deep and ongoing relationship between Indigenous Peoples and the land. Interpretive signage shares context about the carvings and their symbolism, offering an accessible way for community members to learn, reflect, and ask questions.

Truth and Reconciliation is not only about commemorating the past – it is about creating everyday opportunities for learning, respect, and acknowledgement. Totem Park serves as one of those opportunities. By integrating Indigenous art into a public, shared space, the park encourages ongoing awareness of Indigenous presence and perspectives, beyond designated dates or events.

In a community often associated with leisure and tourism, Totem Park offers a different kind of experience. It creates space for reflection, conversation, and understanding, reminding us that reconciliation is a continuous journey that begins with listening and learning.
